The research poster segment is open to all postgraduate researchers (PGR) attending the one day work shop. Whether you are a law student or a biology student the poster submission is open to all disciplines and research that show an interest in the provision of abortion or contraception. The poster presentation will run alongside the workshop and is an opportunity for PGRs to showcase the work they have either completed or are working on during their post graduate study. This is a great opportunity for PGR students to share their work with experts and colleagues in their field of interest, and receive feedback from those who attend the workshop.

The posters will be on display from 10:00am and the PGRs will be given the opportunity to stand by their posters during the lunch break and answer any questions about their research.

All submissions will be entered into a prize draw where three Judges from the days panels will choose one poster to win an amazon voucher. The prize draw will be announced at the end of workshop networking and drinks event.
